The Sparks of Interest

When asked about her motivation to join the finance industry, Ms. Choy reflected on a moment from her university days. “I didn’t want to work at the McDonald’s,” she recalled with a smile. While exploring different opportunities, she came across a voluntary position at a bank. Although the position was unpaid, she dedicated her weekends to tasks like copying and filing. Her hard work and cheerful personality eventually earned her a part-time job offer. “After graduating, I started working there full-time, and that’s how it all began,” she said.

A Day in the Life

Ms. Choy’s typical day at HSBC is packed with meetings and responsibilities. “I start my day at 8 a.m. with a morning meeting where we receive the Chief Investment Officer’s view and market insights,” she explained. Her role involves engaging with various clients, conducting training sessions for her team of 60, and managing multiple meetings throughout the day. Her work often extends to 9 p.m., making her schedule both demanding and dynamic.

Navigating the Challenges

The most challenging part of her job, Ms. Choy shared, is managing her time and meetings with clients. “You never know what a client will say or how they will react to your advice,” she explained. This unpredictability requires her to stay well-prepared and adaptable, turning challenges into valuable learning experiences.

Advice for Aspiring Finance Professionals

For students aspiring to pursue careers in finance or banking, Ms. Choy offered some valuable advice. “Pay attention to math and economics classes, and don’t overlook the importance of language skills,” she emphasized. She explained that being proficient in

different languages can greatly enhance communication with clients and open up more opportunities in the industry.
