Empower women to embrace True Light spirit: Female leadership in modern day workplace

We were honoured to have invited Ms. Nancy Fok, a distinguished Hong Kong True Light College alumna, to grace our occasion, sharing her insights on leadership. Ms. Fok's journey began as a reporter interviewing global celebrities. She later became a website director and held senior publishing positions. Since 2014, she has served as Director of Communications for the New People's Party, leading media and publicity efforts.



Ms. Fok is a strong advocate for female leadership, inspiring others in a world still challenged by outdated and sexist ideologies.

Characteristics of a female leader

"Call me Nancy," Ms. Fok smiled and immediately impressed the team with her sociable and amicable personality. She genuinely embodied the strengths of a successful female leader who is communicable and values trust and collaboration. This is what she advocates. She further explained that communication is the building block for trust and bringing out the best in her team.

Gaining confidence

To ensure effective communication, one challenge we find would be a lack of confidence, feeling unsure. Numerous young women struggle with confidence, especially when faced with situations that push them out of their comfort zones, like public speaking. Ms. Fok shared with us an effective advice that is simple but powerful: practice. With consistent effort and exposure, the fear gradually loses its grip. "Each time you put yourself out there, you prove to yourself that you are capable. Over time, practice doesn't just improve your skills; it builds the confidence needed to pursue even the most ambitious goals," she assured us.

Confronting difficulties

Many students are afraid of making the wrong decisions, often overwhelmed by pressure to have their entire lives figured out. In this regard, Ms. Fok advised us not to face this hardship alone. She reminded students that teenagers, and even protegees, can always seek guidance from those with more life experience, such as our teachers, parents, and peers. So, never take everything up yourself.

Ms. Fok is the living proof that women can hold power and remains a beacon of hope for many. From her story, we can learn that communication, practice, and diligence are the keys to success.
